The journey of a lifetime starts with the turning of a page (Rachel Anders). But there have been so many things that you have had to learn before you can even start to think about turning that first page!

First you must learn your single sounds, blending of three and four sound words, we then like to test you a little and introduce you to some decodable texts. But we also like to mix it up a bit, just to keep you interested and as you know we don't just stop at single sounds! You have to learn two letter sounds, double vowels, the bossy 'e' and split diagraphs followed by some harder decodable texts. But once you have these foundations you are well on your way to turning those pages and beginning that journey.

The skill of reading gives wings to your children's mind, flight to their imagination and life to everything (Plato). educator and a parent, you will hear me say this over and over again. Learning to read is the greatest skill that any child can possess. Reading provides the building of your child's self-confidence at school, their entry point into learning in all other subjects and their first opportunity become an independent learner.

Over the past three years, getting a head start on transitioning our students to school has been a focus. We all know that a smoother transition for our students kick starts the learning process and also reduces the anxiety that many of our students and families may experience, particularly on that first day! Our Kindy Gritters Transition Program has gone from strength to strength. We have continued to work closely with the Bingara Preschool and have our students introduced to their teacher from the beginning of Term 2. Our focus for this year was introducing single sounds and number identification into the program. Working alongside the preschool staff, Miss Schmidt would introduce a sound and a number which would form the focus for the week. We also introduced our parents to 3 lesson plans and associated resources to help build their skills around teaching sounds at home. If we can get our students coming into school already knowing 5-10 sounds then they already have a jump start on their learning. In 2023, Miss Schmidt will be taking on a leadership project to focus on the Kindy Gritter's program and other key transition points throughout the early years of school. Bingara Central is certainly ahead of its time as this strategy has also become a focus for the Department of Education recently.

Popcorn is prepared in the same pot, in the same heat, in the same oil and yet... the kernels do not pop at the same time. Don't compare your child to others. Their turn to pop is coming! (unknown). This theory is also backed up by research and besides the Kindy Gritter's program, we are also extremely proud of our early intervention programs. We all know that students learn differently and they all pop at different times. Miss Withers plays a huge role in this, she makes sure that every kid in the infant's school has their opportunity to pop. She works with the classroom teachers to identify if students need a little help grasping the key concepts of reading in particular. We are thankful to have the skills of, as the kids say, the 'other' Miss Withers and Miss Lucie Boyle. Their ability to teach intensive learning and speech strategies as a part of early intervention is impeccable. We have seen many of our students pop this year and they have been rewarded with the gift of reading.

Our infant's team is a huge part of the great results we are seeing in both the upper primary and secondary school. Our K-2 students have achieved growth rates well above the state average for both literacy and numeracy. We are only 1 of 3 schools in our area that has seen these results and for our students who have only known schooling interrupted by COVID, this is a very pleasing result. One that I can only attest to the classroom teachers who never selected to teach the generic COVID units of work or let COVID interfere with reading and numeracy instruction whilst learning from home, and to the parents who took the last 3 years in their stride, whilst minimising the impact on their child's learning by providing support for them at home. Particularly our Year 2 kids who have not had one year at school that has not had interruptions due to COVID.

All I can say is that with these growth results, our students must be the most resilient and technologically savvy students who have ever passed through


our doors – no offence past students who are now parents!

Next Year Miss Withers will be moving into the Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction roll, we will have a new Year 1 teacher - Miss Azara and Mrs Boughen will be welcoming a new little BCS Gritter! These are a few changes but with them come a new skill set entering the school, more time being dedicated to our students and greater support for our staff with curriculum delivery.

The staff, students and I will continue to stand proudly by our small rural school and the exceptional results our students are receiving. We look forward to a 'cracker' 2023 whilst we continue to deliver quality education to our students. Congratulations to allour students today, we are all very proud of your achievements. 
Stage 6 Biology conducted a field study at the junction this morning as part of the Ecology depth study. We measured many abiotic factors and observed some of the organisms present.








Will your child be in year 7 or 10 next year?
