






Secondary Science

The most enjoyable part was eating the concrete materials! A superstar effort Year 5!























Star of the Week

Stage 3 loved listening to Lily share her knowledge of The Daintree. It was wonderful to see how passionate Lily was about her learning through this Project-based learning activity.







Every time you do **something kind for someone** else your brain releases the hormone, **oxytocin**. Oxytocin leads to increased:




RANDOM ACTS OF KINDNESS
