From the Principals Desk

This week our school community celebrated Education Week, Book Week and the remarkable teaching expertise that shapes our students' lives. It's a time to honour the power of learning, the magic of reading, and the dedication of our educators who inspire the next generation every day.

Last year, Mrs. Fiona Craddock was not only awarded her 20 Years of Service certificate but also received a special recognition on the floor of parliament. Adam Marshall, former Member for Northern Tablelands, delivered a statement in the NSW Legislative celebrating Craddock's Assembly Mrs. dedication to her students and her Department commitment to the of Education at Bingara Central School. Congratulations, Mrs. Craddock, on your remarkable impact and success!



We are also delighted to have Mrs. Anna Boughen back with us this year. While she didn't receive a 20 or 30 Year Service Certificate, she achieved a significant milestone, being awarded her teaching proficiency last year. She was a bit busy at the time, raising her newborn, Brooks! Now, she is balancing motherhood with her early career in teaching, and we're thrilled to have her back.

Another achievement within our teaching department goes to Mr. McGowan, who has received his 30 Years of Service to the Department of Education award.



Mr. McGowan's journey with Bingara Central School began in 1968 when he was enrolled Kindergarten. After graduating, in he pursued a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture at Sydney University, living with his cousins and driving taxis two nights a week for a local Italian family. Following university, Mr. McGowan's career took him across the globe-working on a potato farm in Ireland, a cattle stud in Scotland, and even attempting photography in Russia. In the late 80s, he returned to Bingara, playing Rugby Union for Barraba as a fullback while working on the family farm.



It wasn't long before Mr. McGowan decided it was time to invest in the younger generation, completing his Diploma of Education at the University of New England in 1992. By 1993, he was teaching across Courallie High School, Bundarra Central School, and, of course, Bingara Central School-the school where he always dreamed of teaching. In 1997, his dream became a reality, and he was officially appointed to Bingara Central School in a permanent capacity. Thirty-one years later, he's still living his dream, balancing both teaching and farming.

I came across a staff photo from 1997, Mr. McGowan's first year as a permanent teacher. He was a young, strapping lad with a wellgroomed beard. What struck me was seeing familiar faces alongside him-Mr. Mitch, Mr. Fullbrook, Mrs. Groth, and Mr. Johnston. Remarkably, Mr. Fullbrook and Mr. Johnston returned to Bingara Central School last year, reuniting with Mr. McGowan, Mr Mitch and Mrs Groth, 26 years after that photo was taken! Over the years, Mr. McGowan has taught many of our current staff members, including Mrs. Hellmuth, Miss Lucie, Miss Amanda, Mrs. Caban, and Mrs. Hall. He's also taught Miss Mandy, Mrs. Kristy Johnson and Mrs. Kylie Johnson-and, in this instance, their children as well. A point of pride for Mr. McGowan is that one of his former students, Mrs. Pleffer, is now his boss!

We recently put out a call for memories from Mr. McGowan's former students. One of my favourites comes from Adam (Tobe) Reading, who remembers the 2000 cricket state final against Braidwood in Mudgee. Adam took 5/17 in that match, and Tim McManus scored a brilliant 101. The real highlight? Dismissing their captain, who had scored 150 the previous day, with a Royal Golden Duck on the first delivery. Mr. McGowan still refers to it as the 'ball of the century!'

Congratulations, Mr. McGowan, on an incredible 30 years of service, and thank you for the lasting impact you've made on our school and community."

SCHOOL STUDENT BROADBAND INITIATIVE

The Australian Government has established the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) to provide free home internet for up to 30,000 unconnected families with school aged students until the end of December, 2025.

To be eligible for SSBI, families must:

- Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school (up to year 12 including Prep in Qld/Vic/Tas, Kindy in NSW, Reception in SA, Transition in NT/ACT and Pre-Primary in WA).
- Not have an active nbn[®] network internet service at home. Having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility.
- Live in a premises that can access the **nbn** network via a standard connection.
- Not have had an active nbn connection during the previous 14 days.
